



T3 Volunteers Needed

Interested in working one-on-one with “at-risk” teens? Would you like to share what you know about searching the Internet?

As part of the Contra Costa County Library’s **Technology for Teens in Transition (T3)** outreach program, volunteers will work one-on-one with incarcerated youth at Juvenile Hall. The volunteer will spend quality time helping teens find online information relevant to their lives. Volunteers will work with many people, but usually with only one at a time.

Examples of Duties

The volunteer will work a regular shift of 90 minutes to two hours every week, assisting students either on evenings or weekends. The job involves signing in, setting up the computer, suggesting topics for searches if needed, helping the young person with searches, listening as well as advising, and putting the equipment away.

Qualifications and Skills

- Interest in working with At-Risk Youth
- Enjoy searching the Internet
- Respect cultural diversity
- Patience, flexibility, good listening skills and the ability to turn Internet troubles into models of problem solving.
- Must provide own transportation, proof of insurance, and current California Driver’s License
- Must be 21 years of age or older
- Must complete two T3 training sessions at Juvenile Hall. Additional training and assistance is available.

Working Conditions

Volunteers will be matched with youth who have earned the privilege of using the computer. For some youth, this will be their first experience with an adult who chooses to spend time with them.
